Good afternoon,

From Monday 17th May, students will no longer be advised to wear a face covering at any point during the school day; including corridors and classrooms, unless they choose to do so. A copy of the updated guidance from the DfE on Face Coverings in Education can be found here

However, students who travel to school by bus will still need to wear a face covering throughout the duration of the journey, unless exempt. Students will then remove their face covering on arrival at school and follow the guidance for sanitising their hands. These key messages will be made available to students on arrival at school on Monday and are contained in the updated Risk Assessment which can be found on the school website.

Can I also take this opportunity to remind you that students should continue to complete lateral flow tests at home each Sunday and Wednesday and upload the results to https://www.gov.uk/report-covid19-result and the Academy, using the link for their year group. If your child needs additional test kits, these can be obtained from the main office.
