Good morning,

I am writing to parents and carers today to communicate my decision to advise our students to wear a face covering / mask in school corridors from Monday 27th September; unless they are exempt from doing so. They will not be advised to wear them at other times in the school day, unless they travel by bus, and I view this decision as an extra-cautionary response to a number of confirmed cases of Covid-19 since we began the new school term. This step is not being made in response to any external guidance but instead is a decision I have made with our Chair of Governors and aligns with decision-making in at least one other local secondary school. We will ensure students are provided with a face mask if they are unable to bring one to school on Monday and students will only be advised to wear one at this time. If your child is new to the school and you wish to inform us they are exempt, please contact us at parents@holbrookacademy.org

This is also a next step which aligns with my cautionary decision not to hold our big annual Open Evening event next week. Instead, we look forward to inviting small number of prospective parents onto site; ensuring that clear social distancing measures can be maintained throughout their time to further protect our students, staff and community.

As part of our open week we are ensuring that three of our wonderful students have an opportunity to speak formally with prospective parents and I attach to this weekly communication a copy of their speeches. I hope you agree with me that they really do reflect the very best of our school learning community.
