Holbrook Academy is thrilled to have joined 'Hop to it! Suffolk 2025', St Elizabeth Hospice's new hare sculpture art trail.

The spectacular free public art event that will hop onto the streets of Ipswich in the summer of 2025, and for the first time locations in Beccles, Felixstowe, Lowestoft and Woodbridge.





We have adopted our very own little stargazer leveret hare and will be joining the trail as part of the Learning and Community programme, Hopscotch! The project is a wonderful opportunity to spark creativity and imagination while learning and experiencing different art forms.

We will be creating a beautiful design to decorate our own little stargazer leveret, which will be displayed alongside the large hares in the summer of 2025 for everyone to admire our fantastic creativity and imagination.

We are fundraising to help raise vital funds for St Elizabeth Hospice, an independent Suffolk charity, which every year delivers care to over 4,000 patients and their families throughout East Suffolk, Great Yarmouth and Waveney, who are living with a progressive or life-limiting illness.

These services cost around £12m to facilitate each year, with the charity raising 70% of funds via revenue streams and the generosity of the community through support of its retail shops and fundraising activities.

In 2015, St Elizabeth Hospice launched Zest - a young adult service which supports those aged 14 and above with progressive & incurable illnesses. They work closely with children's hospice services to ensure young adults have a smooth transition into adult care, tailored treatment and services they need to be able to enjoy life to the full.
